## SARAJEVO

### city hall...

The Sarajevo City Hall was designed by Czech architect Karl Paržik in 1891. It is the largest and most representative object from the Austro-Hungarian period, built in Pseudo-Moorish style and is truly a symbol of Sarajevo as a mixture of the East and the West.



## SARAJEVO

### clock tower...

The Sahat kula in Baščaršija, located next to the Bey's Mosque, is the tallest and most beautiful clock tower in Bosnia and Herzegovina, built in the late 16th or early 17th century. It is believed to be the only public clock in the world that keeps lunar time (a la turca), making it always seem like it is broken.



## SARAJEVO

### sebilj fountain...

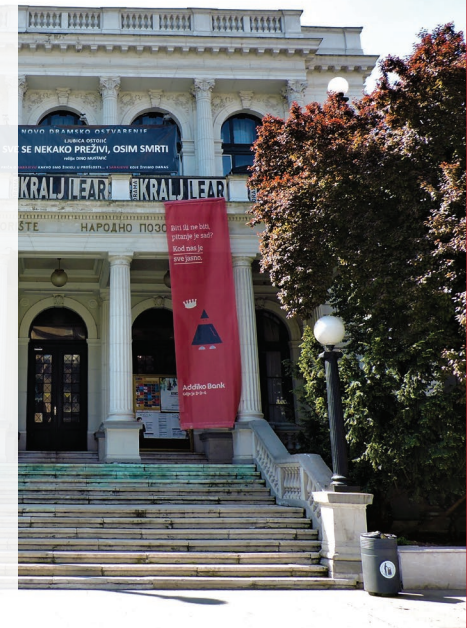
Sebilj is a kiosk-shaped public fountain made of wood and stone usually built at the public squares or at intersections of important roads. Such fountains were common in the lands that were ruled by the Ottoman Empire. It is one of the most recognizable symbols of Sarajevo.



## SARAJEVO

### national theatre...

The National Theatre is the largest and the oldest theatre in Bosnia and Herzegovina, founded in 1921. Initially it was used exclusively as a drama theatre and today on its repertoire are drama, opera and ballet performances. It is a national monument of Bosnia and Herzegovina.



## SARAJEVO

### national museum...

The National Museum of Bosnia and Herzegovina is the oldest modern cultural and scientific institution in the country, founded in 1888. The four pavilions connected by the terraces surround the beautifully decorated botanical garden. There is a valuable collection of unique Bosnian tombstones called "Stećci".



## SARAJEVO

### city market...

The City Market Hall was built in 1894 in the Neo-Renaissance style, while the front facade with arches is designed in ancient architecture style. In addition to its primary function, the market building represents a tourist attraction as one of the most beautiful Austro-Hungarian buildings in the city.



## SARAJEVO

### bezistan...

Gazi Husrev-Bey's Bazaar, also known as the Great Bezistan is a structure built around 1550, which still serves its original purpose-trade. Its architecture resembles the Kapali Carsi markets and bazaars of Turkey or trading souks in Arab countries. It is a part of the Gazi-Husrev Bey's Vakuf (endowments).



## SARAJEVO

### academy of fine arts...

This structure was built in 1889 in the Roman-Byzantine style and served as an Evangelistic Church. Since 1981 it houses the Academy of Fine Arts. Located on the left bank of the Miljacka river, the Academy of Fine Arts is one of the most beautiful buildings in the city.
