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national museum...

The National Museum of Bosnia and Herzegovina, founded in 1888, is the oldest museum of Western type in the country. The museum houses the Departments of Archeology, Ethnology, Natural History and a stunning Botanical garden. It is also a home to one of the world's greatest treasures, the Sarajevo Haggadah.



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historical museum...

The Historical Museum of Bosnia and Herzegovina was founded in 1945 under the name of the Museum of National Revolution of Bosnia and Herzegovina. The museum features the history of the two world wars and an impressive permanent display of the '92-'95 war photos about the longest siege.



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brusa bezistan...

The Museum of Sarajevo was founded in 1949 and displays chronicles of the history of Sarajevo through different eras. Currently, the museum's collection is available at Brusa bezistan, built in 1551.



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sarajevo 1878-1918...

The Museum "Sarajevo 1878-1918" explores Sarajevo under the Austro-Hungarian rule. It is a major showcase of the photos, films and artefacts from that period. The museum is situated on the historic site where the actual assassination of the Archduke Franz Ferdinand and his wife Sophie, took place.



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sorzo house...

This stunning 18th century house portrays a life of a Muslim family in the urban area at that time. It is also a typical example of the contemporary Bosnian architecture. The house includes a section for men and women and their respective gardens.



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despić house...

This house depicts the life of an Orthodox Sarajevan family in the late 19th and early 20th century. Once a gathering place of Sarajevo's intellectual community the house served as a precursor to the city's modern theatre.



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jewish museum...

The Jewish Museum of Bosnia and Herzegovina is housed in the oldest Jewish synagogue in the country built in 1851. It explores the history of the local Jewish community including their everyday life and sufferings during the WWII.



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tunnel of hope...

The Tunnel of Hope was built on July 30, 1993 as the only window of Sarajevo into the world. It has become a symbol of resistance of unarmed people. The permanent display includes photos, 20-m of the original tunnel, and movies about the siege of Sarajevo.
