bey's mosque...

Gazi Husrev-Bey's Mosque is also known as the Bey's Mosque. Built in the 16th century this mosque is the largest Ottoman mosques in Bosnia and Herzegovina and one of the most representative structures from the period in the Balkans. The mosque is situated in the centre of Baščaršija.

cathedral...

The Cathedral of Jesus' Sacred Heart was built in 1889 and its architectural design was inspired by the Notre Dame of Dijon in France. As a centerpiece of Sarajevo's multi-confessional culture, the Cathedral is a famous meeting place.



SARAJEVO

orthodox cathedral...

The Congregational Church of the Holy Mother is the largest Orthodox church in Sarajevo and one of the largest of its kind in the Balkans. Built during the last few years of the Ottoman rule, the church is an interesting combination of Neo-Baroque and Byzantine architecture.

ashkenazi synagogue...

The Sarajevo Synagogue was built in 1902 in Pseudo-Moorish style. It is the third largest synagogue in Europe and remains the only active Jewish temple in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

emperor's mosque...

Built in 1462 the Emperor's Mosque is one of the first mosques built in Bosnia and Herzegovina and the oldest in Sarajevo. It is presumed that Isa Bey Ishaković, the founder of Sarajevo, had this place of worship built soon after the city's founding in 1462 in honor of Sultan Mehmed II "the Conqueror".



SARAJEVO

st. anthony church...

The Church of St. Anthony of Padua is a Roman Catholic place and a national monument of Bosnia and Herzegovina. It is dedicated to the Franciscan friar Anthony of Padua. At the time when it was built in 1882 this was the only church in Sarajevo.



SARAJEVO

old orthodox church...

This is one of the oldest sacral objects in the Balkans. It is situated in the old town, near Baščaršija square and Sebilj. The church houses its own museum with valuable icons in its collection for which it is considered as one of the most important Orthodox museums in the world.



SARAJEVO

sarajevo haggadah...

The Sarajevo Haggadah represents a collection of religious rules and traditions arranged in the order of the Seder observed on Passover, the holiday celebrating the liberation of the Jews from slavery in Egypt. This illuminated Jewish codex is known around the world as the Sarajevo Haggadah.
